For example: bulletin board, employee locker room wall, a tool kit/binder for mobile work spaces, etc.	A consolidated version includes the OH&S Act and common regulations in one book.
	Health & Safety at Work - Prevention Starts Here poster (MOL)	Visible and accessible location for all employees.	Provide poster in English and the language(s) best understood by the workers. See Resource section.
	In Case of Injury at Work poster (WSIB Form 82)	Visible and accessible location for all employees.	See Resource section.
	Policies Health and safety policy statement Violence policy statement Harassment policy statement	Visible and accessible location for all employees.	Policies may be combined into one document.
	Worker H&S Rep Name and work location	Visible and accessible location for all employees.	
	Monthly Inspection report by worker rep	Visible and accessible location for all employees.	Report is provided to the employer.
	If applicable: Ministry of Labour Orders and Notice of Compliance	Visible and accessible location for all employees.	Work Orders or Field Visit reports if applicable.
	If applicable: Occupational hygiene test results	Visible and accessible location for all employees.	Example: Noise level or air quality testing.
	If applicable: Designated substance* assessment	Visible and accessible location for all employees.	





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	If applicable: Warning sign at every approach to an area in the workplace where the sound level regularly exceeds 85 dBA.	Clearly visible	
	 Emergency Contact Numbers. Examples: Fire, police, ambulance, utility (hydro/gas) Poison control centre: 1-800-268-9017 Ministry of Labour: 1-877-202-0008 Ministry of Environment: 1-800-268-6060 	Visible and accessible location for all employees. Posted at all primary phones.	
	Evacuation procedures, safe room or space (for inclement weather or other events), and fire map	Visible and accessible locations for all employees; specific to work areas.	This document should be created internally; specific to building requirements.
	First Aid station locations Valid First Aid training certificates	Visible and accessible location for all employees. Certificates at the First Aid station.	Applies to firms covered under the WSI Act
	Employment Standards in Ontario poster (MOL)	Provide each worker with a copy. Visible and accessible location for all employees.	Provide poster in English and the language(s) best understood by the workers. See Resource section.

^{*}Designated Substances are substances which have been designated as hazardous by the MOL. They include: acrylonitrile, arsenic, asbestos, benzene, coke oven emissions, ethylene oxide, isocyanates, lead mercury, silica and vinyl chloride.
